8:30 - 11:30 A.M.— Technology Centers That Work

Dr. Ann Benson will present an overview and introduction to a rapidly growing initiative, *Technology Centers that Work*. This initiative, administered by the Southern Regional Education Board and patterned after the highly successful *High Schools that Work Network*, was started in 2007 to target strategies to help students in the shared-time centers (where students leave their home campus for a portion of the school day, week or year to receive career preparation) be successful in both careers *and* further studies. Using data that represents proven practices that help increase both technical and academic performance. Ann will help participants have a better understanding of how *TCTW* works for the career-technical centers.

12:30 - 3:30 P.M.— Building a Green Economy Workforce

This interactive workshop will focus on how to prepare workers for the emerging green collar economy. The workshop opens with an overview of everything “green”, what it means to be green, how it applies to our daily lives and our workplaces, and how it impacts our education and training systems. Three experts working in the green industry will also review the standards applied to green building and the accompanying certifications that will be required of green collar workers. The workshop continues with an introduction to the newly formed Illinois Green Economy Network and how community colleges are meeting the demands for green training and working with partners in their respective communities. This workshop wouldn't be complete without a look at successful, existing green training programs and projects for K-12 students, post-secondary students and existing workers.
